COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This is a studio course in Storytelling. This course covers how to write animated stories that create vivid experiences through plot, structure, conflict, crisis points and climax. Examples of well-developed storylines, told in a variety of mediums, will be viewed and discussed. Students will learn to convey non-verbal stories through hand-sketched storyboards and animatics. Students will work with digital programs, including Photoshop and After Effects, to transform and enhance their storyboards into effective digital pre-visualization. Brainstorming and critique sessions will help develop a stronger narrative based on instructor and peer feedback. In the second half of the semester, a vocabulary of cinematic storytelling devices and conventions will be introduced to allow students to add unspoken, visual elements to enhance and extend their storytelling capabilities.

COURSE LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

At the successful conclusion of this course, students will have mastered:

- 1. The basic understanding of visual storytelling and narrative through images.
- 2. The understanding of the principles employed in storytelling and in its translation into the digital medium..
- The ability to develop and work within a digital environment to create animations.
- 4. The ability to communicate complex concepts employed in video production using only simple images, graphics, and text.

INSTRUCTIONAL PROCEDURES

Lectures, demonstrations, and instructions.

Critiques and group discussions.

Class direction on projects and one on one individual development.

REQUIRED RESOURCES:

- 1. It is essential that you have large capacity removable media with you during class.
- 2. The Software Applications required: Adobe Photoshop, After Effects, and Illustrator.

Important Note: File management is an essential aspect of digital production. Students are required to back up their work in a safe place. This includes images and project files being incorporated into your project. Loss of files is not an excuse to hand a project in late. Projects left on the hard drive of the FDU computers without backup may be subject to removal which will result in permanent loss of work (i.e. the project must be recreated by the student.)

MINIMUM TECHNICAL SKILLS EXPECTED

- 1. Photoshop basic skills.
- 2. Communicate and send assignments via email.
- 3. Create a basic account on Vimeo.com to house assignments.
- 4. Upload and download compressed files and decompress as needed.

NOTE: A minimum of 4 hours of time outside of class is required each week to practice techniques and to work on individual projects. Any problems or questions can be raised in class and addressed either as a group lesson or on an individual basis. More time spent on projects will ultimately enhance the quality of your work. Additional individual help beyond the class time is available and can be scheduled upon request.

EVALUATION:

The final class grade will be based upon:

- 1. Projects and Assignments.
- 3. The Final Project.
- 4. Attendance, In Class Participation and Extra Credit Work.

Projects handed in late for any reason will be graded down for lateness by 10% for each week. All important information such as past lecture notes and assignments can be found in the Archive section of the class website.
